- The National Mission for Clean Ganga (NMCG) will observe 'Ganga Cleanliness Pledge Day' on 02nd May 2017 at various places in the river's basin states to spread awareness and ensure public participation in the program.
- India will give Rs 35 crore to children of freedom fighters in Bangladesh in the next five years under the new 'Muktijodha scholarship' scheme.

Former Union minister Ashwani Kumar has been selected by Japan for this year's Spring Imperial Decorations, for his contribution to the strengthening of bilateral ties and promotion of friendship between the two countries.

- International Labour Day, also known as International Worker's Day or May Day is observed on 01st of May every year to promote and encourage the international labour associations.
- Turkey's President Recep Tayyip Erdogan was given the ceremonial reception at Rashtrapati Bhawan in New Delhi. The visiting dignitary will hold delegation level talks with PM Modi.
- Aymanam ward in the Kerala district on became India's first digitalised panchayat ward. Union minister of state for social justice and empowerment Krishan Pal Gurjar inaugurated the website of the first digitalised panchayat ward number 15 of Aymanam gram panchayat.
- Maharashtra Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis has inaugurated the State's first automatic weather station at Dongargaon in Vidarbha region.

The Real Estate (Regulation and Development) Act, 2016 (RERA) has come into force, aimed to protect the interests of homebuyers across the country and bring transparency.

- Google has announced the new "Solve for India" initiative, especially for tier-2 cities such as Pune, Jaipur, Hyderabad, Kolkata, Kochi, Indore, Nagpur, Nashik, Madurai, Kanpur, and Chennai.
- The United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR) has appointed Syrian refugee and Olympic athlete Yusra Mardini as a Goodwill Ambassador. Valtteri Bottas (Mercedes) claimed his first Formula One victory, taking the flag at the Russian Grand Prix.
- Rafael Nadal won a record-extending 10th Barcelona Open title by defeating Dominic Thiem of Austria.  
India's top cueist Pankaj Advani lost to China's Lv Haotian in the summit clash of Asian Snooker Championship held in Doha, Qatar.
- Joshna Chinappa scripted history by becoming the first Indian to clinch the Asian Squash title with a thrilling win over compatriot Dipika Pallikal Karthik in the women's final.
- Famous Sufi singer and daughter of legendary Sitar Maestro (late) Ustad Vilayat Ali Khan, Begum Yaman K. Khan has passed away after multiple organ failures.
- India and Turkey have strongly condemned the "use of double standards" in combating terrorism and agreed to strengthen cooperation in effectively dealing with the menace both bilaterally and at multilateral fora.
- Minister of State (I/C) for Labour and Employment, Shri Bandaru Dattatreya launched two schemes "One IP- Two Dispensaries" and "Aadhaar based Online Claim Submission". One IP- Two Dispensaries scheme has given an option to an Insured Person (IP) to choose two dispensaries, one for self and another for the family through an employer. Under Aadhaar based Online Claim Submission scheme, all EPF Members who have activated their Universal Account Number (UAN) and seeded their KYC (Aadhaar) with EPFO will be able to apply for PF final settlement, Pension withdrawal benefit and PF part withdrawal from their UAN Interface directly.
- Union HRD Prakash Javadekar launched 'Students for soldiers- a nationwide Vidya-Veerta Abhiyan' to encourage Universities to display portraits of Param Veer Chakra-decorated soldiers. The aim of this Abhiyan is to instill a sense of patriotism and nationalism among students.
- Mr. Anthony Lianzuala took over as the New Controller General of Accounts (CGA), Department of Expenditure, Ministry of Finance.

- Ms. Shobana Kamineni, Executive VC, Apollo Hospitals Enterprise Ltd., assumed office as the new President of CII. She is the first woman President of CII. Mr. Rakesh Bharti Mittal, VC, Bharti Enterprises, is the new President-Designate, CII.
- Defence Minister (Additional Charge) Arun Jaitley handed-over the devices to NDRF includes 'E-Nasika', a hand-held equipment which is capable of rapid detection of chemical agents well below their toxic limits & to NSG an equipment called 'OTL-300' which can instantly detect partially camouflaged optical elements.
- Dubai has become the first city in the world to get its own Microsoft font. The font, available in three styles as 'Dubai', 'Dubai Medium' and 'Dubai Light', can be in italics, underlined and bold.
- Andhra Pradesh CM Chandrababu Naidu selected for the 'Transformative Chief Minister Award 2017' in recognition for his role in advancing the US-India partnership at the state level.
- Bollywood actor Aamir Khan launched renowned actress of her age, Asha Parekh's autobiography "Asha Parekh: The Hit Girl" in New Delhi.
- Bharti Enterprises, one of India's leading business groups, has appointed Soumen (Sam) Ghosh as Managing Director of Financial Services.
- Every year, 3rd May is celebrated as the World Press Freedom Day. It is celebrated by UNESCO. The 4th National Standards Conclave held in New Delhi. The objective was to bring awareness and prepare Industries, Central Government Ministries etc on the growing importance of "Standards".
- Madhya Pradesh has become the first state to switch to the January-December financial year from the existing April-March cycle.
- Manoj Sinha, Minister of State (Independent Charge) for Communications and Minister of State for Railways, formally launched the 'Tarang Sanchar portal'. The web portal is for Information sharing on Mobile Towers and EMF Emission Compliances. The portal aims to generate confidence among the public about the effectiveness of the EMF compliance process in India.
- Mallikarjun Kharge is the new chairman of the 21- member (14 from Lok Sabha and 7 from Rajya Sabha) Public Accounts Committee (PAC) of Parliament. The chairman of PAC is appointed by the speaker of Lok Sabha.
- Hollywood film The Black Prince, featuring singer-poet Satinder Sartaaj and veteran actress Shabana Azmi, was awarded the Special Jury Remi Award at the 50th annual Worldfest-Houston International Film Festival (WHIFF). The film is Directed by Kavi Raj.
- Chairman of Nicco group Rajive Kaul was conferred with the Order of Diplomatic Service Merit Sungnye Medal of the Republic of Korea for his services rendered as honorary consul general of South Korea in Kolkata. According to the The 'Swachh Survekshan 2017' Survey, Indore in Madhya Pradesh is India's cleanest city while Gonda in Uttar Pradesh is the dirtiest. Gujarat has the maximum of 12 cities among the top 50 clean cities, closely followed by Madhya Pradesh with 11 and Andhra Pradesh with eight. Uttar Pradesh accounted for half of the bottom 50 cities in the cleanliness ranking.
- Around two years from now, the Chenab river in Jammu and Kashmir will be spanned by the world's highest railway bridge that is expected to be 35 metres taller than Paris' Eiffel Tower. It will rise 359 m above the river bed. The 1.315-km- long "engineering marvel" will connect Bakkal (Katra) and Kauri (Srinagar).
- Union Cabinet approved Vijayawada Airport as International Airport recently.
- Minister of Road Transport and Highways Nitin Gadkari has inaugurated two exhibitions namely 'The Highway Saga: Past Present and Future' and 'Safe Road and Inter- State Highways Transforming India (SRISHTI)' at Vigyan Bhawan in New Delhi.
- As per the UN's 'The Economic and Social Survey of Asia and the Pacific 2017', India is expected to achieve 7.1 percent growth this year & would edge up to 7.5 percent for 2018.
- Chhattisgarh successfully auctioned its third limestone block, Kesla-II to Dalmia Cement with the highest bid received 96.15% of IBM (Indian Bureau of Mines) prices which are 20 times more than the reserve price. Kesla-II block is situated in the Tilda Tehsil of Raipur district of Chhattisgarh and covers over 357 hectares of area with an average grade of 43% CaO.

- China-sponsored Asian Infrastructure Investment Bank (AIIB) has recently approved USD 160 million loan for a power project in Andhra Pradesh, the first credit from the bank for an Indian project. The objective is to strengthen the power transmission and distribution system in Andhra Pradesh.
- Braj Bihari Kumar, the editor of quarterly journals Dialogue and Chintan Srijan, has been appointed as the Chairman of the Indian Council of Social Science Research (ICSSR). ii. He has succeeded famous economist S K Thorat.
- CCEA given its approval for restructuring the schemes of the Ministry of Food Processing Industries (MoFPI) under new Central Sector Scheme – SAMPADA (Scheme for Agro-Marine Processing and Development of Agro- Processing Clusters) for the period 2016-20 coterminous with the 14th Finance Commission cycle. SAMPADA with an allocation of Rs. 6,000 crore is expected to leverage the investment of Rs. 31,400 crore will benefit 20 lakh farmers and generate 5,30,500 direct/ indirect employment in the country by the year 2019-20. The objective of SAMPADA is to supplement agriculture, modernize processing and decrease agri- waste.
- Cabinet given its approval for National Steel Policy (NSP) 2017. It seeks to enhance domestic steel consumption and ensure high-quality steel production and create a technologically advanced and globally competitive steel industry. The NSP 2017 aims to achieve 300 million tonnes of steel-making capacity by 2030.
- India opened its first private small arms manufacturing plant at Malanpur, Madhya Pradesh in a joint venture with Israel. The plant has been set up as a joint venture Punj Lloyd Raksha Systems between Indian defence conglomerate Punj Lloyd and Israel Weapons Industries (IWI).
- India has launched the Geosynchronous Satellite Launch Vehicle (GSLV-F09) carrying the GSAT-9 or the “South Asia” satellite. The satellite was lifted off from the Satish Dhawan Space Centre in Sriharikota in Andhra Pradesh. Nepal, Bhutan, Afghanistan, Maldives, Bangladesh and Sri Lanka agreed but Pakistan is not a part of the project that was initially christened the SAARC satellite. The lift-off mass of GSLV-F09 is about 2,230 kg which includes the satellite and its launch vehicle. The mission lifespan is 12 years.
- Insolvency and Bankruptcy Board of India (IBBI) has constituted Technical Committee to lay down Technical Standards for the performance of core services and other services in accordance with Regulation 14 of the IBBI (Information Utilities) Regulations, 2017. The committee will be Chaired by Dr. R. B. Barman.
- Madhya Pradesh government has passed a resolution granting river Narmada the status of a living entity and committed itself to the protection of its legal rights. Reliance Corporate IT Park Ltd. (RCITPL) has signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with enterprise application software major SAP SE to launch 'SARAL GST' solution for taxpayers.
- The Indian men’s national football team has made it into the top 100 of the FIFA (International Federation of Association Football) world football rankings for the first time in 21 years. As per the updated rankings on May 4, India, with a total of 331 points, have climbed a spot and are now placed 100th.
- Thirty-four MoUs amounting to about Rs 2 lakh crores were signed in the three-day India Integrated Transport and Logistics Summit that was concluded in New Delhi. Haryana government has decided to open canteens offering meals at subsidized rates to registered construction workers under the "Antyodaya Anna Yojana" at 23 locations in the state.
- The promulgation of the Banking Regulation (Amendment) Ordinance, 2017 inserting two new Sections (viz. 35AA and 35AB) after Section 35A of the Banking Regulation Act, 1949 enables the Union Government to authorize the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) to direct banking companies to resolve specific stressed assets by initiating insolvency resolution process, where required. The RBI has also been empowered to issue other directions for resolution, and appoint or approve for appointment, authorities or committees to advise banking companies for stressed asset resolution.
- Usha Ananthasubramanian, MD, and CEO, Punjab National Bank, has been appointed as MD & CEO of Allahabad Bank.
- Sunil Mehta, Executive Director, Corporation Bank, has been appointed as MD & CEO of Punjab National Bank. Dinabandhu Mohapatra, Executive Director at Canara Bank, as MD and CEO of Bank of India.

- G Rajkiran Rai, Executive Director at Oriental Bank of Commerce, has been appointed MD & CEO of Union Bank of India, for a period of three years.  
R Subramaniakumar, Executive Director, Indian Overseas Bank, has been elevated as MD & CEO of the bank.
- RA Sankara Narayanan, ED, Bank of India, has been appointed MD & CEO of Vijaya Bank.  
MO Rego, MD & CEO of Bank of India, has been appointed MD & CEO of Syndicate Bank.
- World Red Cross Day is observed on May 8 every year to commemorate the birth anniversary of Henry Dunant, the founder of the Red Cross as well as the founder of International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC). Theme for this year (2017) is "Less Known Red Cross Stories"
- Prime Minister Narendra Modi addressed an Indian heads of mission meet in New Delhi, which is brainstorming key foreign policy issues and challenges including India's engagement with major powers as well as strain in ties with Pakistan and China.
- Union Minister for Road Transport and Highway Nitin Gadkari inaugurated the country's first bio-refinery plant which produces ethanol from the variety of biomass. The project is situated at Rahu in Pune district. Odisha will introduce boat ambulance service in four districts where people face difficulties in getting health service. The boat ambulance service will be available in the districts of Koraput, Malkangiri, Kendrapara and Kalahandi where people face problems in availing 108 ambulance service.
- India has organized a cultural festival in Egypt to mark the 156th birth anniversary of the famous Indian poet, Rabindranath Tagore. The Tagore festival is being organized by the Maulana Azad Centre for Indian Culture, the cultural wing of the Indian Embassy in Cairo. The Hinduja brothers have topped the 2017 list of the richest 1,000 people in the UK with an estimated fortune of 16.2 billion pounds, a massive 3.2 billion pound hike in their fortunes over the previous year.
- Three Indian Scientist have been elected as the Fellows of The Royal Society, a premier scientific academy of the United Kingdom and the Commonwealth, for their "outstanding contributions to science". Krishna Chatterjee, Subhash Khot & Yadvinder Malhi.

Renowned tea planter from Assam Prabhat Kamal Bezboruah has been named the new chairman of the Tea Board of India by replacing Shri Santosh Sarangi. Pro-European centrist leader Emmanuel Macron has been elected as President of France. Mr. Macron will also become the first President from outside the two traditional main parties since the modern republic's foundation in 1958.

- India's cricket icon Sachin Tendulkar plans to support charities and various initiatives to help the under-privileged people. He has received the Fellowship Award at the 7th annual Asian Awards in UK. India's playback singer Adnan Sami won the award for 'Outstanding achievement in Music'.
- Kashmir based freelance photographer Saqib Majeed has bagged prestigious 2016 Wisden-MCC (Melbourne Cricket Council) Cricket 'Photograph of the Year' for capturing a stunning image of boys playing cricket at the Nishat garden in the outskirts of Srinagar.
- Leila Seth, the first woman judge of the Delhi high court and member of the Justice J. S. Verma committee that was set up to re-look at rape laws in India died of a cardiac arrest.
- Legendary sitar player Ustad Raaes Khan Passed awayd. He was 77.  
Indian boxer Shiva Thapa ended up with a silver medal in the 60-kg category at the Asian Boxing Championships in Tashkent, Uzbekistan.
- Great Britain beat Australia 4-3 in a thrilling hockey final of the 26th edition of the Azlan Shah Cup at Ipoh, Malaysia. India outclassed New Zealand 4-0 to clinch a bronze medal.
- Facebook has launched its 'Express Wi-Fi' commercially in India and the service is now available via 700 hotspots across four states of Uttarakhand, Gujarat, Rajasthan and Meghalaya.
- India has been unanimously elected as the President of UN-Habitat, an organ of the United Nations Organisation. Haryana CM Manohar Lal Khattar has decided to gather a detailed data of every resident and issue a sleek identity for every house in Haryana. The objective of this two-month long data generating exercise, to be launched on June 15, 2017 is to get details of land holdings and status of facilities.

- Techmagnate, India's leading Digital Marketing Agency acquired BlogX, India's largest blog conference where bloggers and content managers connect.  
India's largest cab aggregator Ola has partnered with Bharti Airtel to launch a range of integrated digital offerings to customers.
- The Government of Jharkhand and Oracle signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) intended to improve cloud-based citizen services and to make Jharkhand an attractive destination for start-ups. Oracle will offer its support to the state through its vast portfolio of technology solutions, including Oracle Cloud.
- Department of Industrial Policy and Promotion (DIPP) and World Intellectual Property Organization (WIPO) have signed an agreement to establish Technology and Innovation Support Centers (TISC).
- India's growth is expected to rebound to 7.2 percent in the 2017-18 fiscal and 7.7 percent in 2018-19 after disruptions caused by demonetization, as per the IMF (International Monetary Fund) report. According to the report, growth in Asia is forecast to accelerate to 5.5 percent in 2017 from 5.3 percent in 2016.
- The government of Pakistan has approved the appointment of Sohail Mahmood as Pakistan's next high commissioner to India.

Edelweiss Tokio launched India's first and the simplest life insurance product that can be bought at a point of sale (PoS) has finally been launched. Edelweiss Tokio Life Insurance has recently launched PoS Saral Nivesh the first product to be approved by the Insurance Regulatory and Development Authority of India's (IRDAI) guidelines on point of sale-life insurance products. PoS Saral Nivesh is a non-linked, non-participating endowment life insurance plan which offers both protection and saving.

- Jordan and the United States kicked off Eager Lion, an annual military exercise in Jordan with about 7,400 troops from more than 20 nations taking part.  
Press Secretary to President Pranab Mukherjee and senior diplomat Venu Rajamony has been appointed India's Ambassador to the Netherlands.
- Hollywood actor Emma Watson picked up the first-ever Genderless Acting Award for the Best Actor category for "Beauty and the Beast" at the MTV Movie and TV Awards.
- Child actor Sunny Pawar, best known for his performance in the Oscar-nominated film Lion, has been chosen for the Rising Star Award.
- "Mukti Bhawan", a movie about a man who accompanies his father on a journey to Varanasi, has won the Best Film at the New York Indian Film Festival (NYIFF). Odisha Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik has unveiled the logo and mascot of the 22nd Asian Athletics Championships scheduled to be held at the Kalinga Stadium in Bhubaneswar from July 6 to 9, 2017. The mascot, named Olly Turtle, depicts the Olive Ridley turtles.
- Heena Sindhu claimed a bronze medal in the women's 10m Air Pistol as India ended the Grand Prix of Liberation Plezn 2017 Shooting championships in Czech Republic with seven medals.
- The World Migratory Bird Day is observed every year on 10 May. The theme of WMBD 2017 is "Their Future is Our Future – A Healthy Planet for Migratory Birds and People".
- Union Home Minister Rajnath Singh announced a new strategy against the Maoists—SAMADHAN. The Minister explained the acronym as S-smart leadership, A- aggressive strategy, M-motivation and training, A- actionable intelligence, D-dashboard-based KPIs (key performance indicators) and KRAs (key result areas), H- harnessing technology, A-action plan for each theatre and N-no access to financing.  
The Finance Ministry has set up an Investor Facilitation Platform that will provide information about stocks of public sector units. It is set up by the Department of Investment and Public Asset Management (DIPAM). Cashback portal Cashkaro.com has tied up with YES Bank to launch card-linked offers as part of its loyalty programme for both offline and online shoppers. Technology giant Oracle has launched its cloud computing service for India, which aims to support the government's GST rollout in July and plans to open data centres in the country. Oracle's ERP

solution aims to provide support for GST Network integration, statutory reporting, payment processing, among others.

- South Korea's liberal leader Moon Jae-In took the oath as president, tasked with navigating the country out of rising tensions over North Korea's nuclear program and the risk of a rift with the United States.
- Apple Inc became the first US company to top the \$800 billion mark in market capitalization slightly more than two years after it crossed the \$700 billion thresholds. Jhulan Goswami, India's fast bowler, is now the leading wicket-taker in Women's ODIs, going past Australia's Cathryn Fitzpatrick record of 180 wickets.
- N'Golo Kante has been voted Footballer of the Year by the Football Writers' Association. India celebrates National Technology Day: 11th May The theme of the function is "Technology for inclusive and sustainable growth".
- Prime Minister Narendra Modi launched the integrated case management system of the Supreme Court in the presence of the Chief Justice of India Jagdish Singh Khehar. The system will help litigants access data and retrieve information online and will be a step towards a paperless Supreme Court.
- The government of India has set up a high-level task force to compute timely data on employment in the country, a move that will go a long way to help government frame policies and take steps that can create jobs in the country. The task force has been created under the chairmanship of NITI Aayog's vice chairman Arvind Panagariya.
- Russian Deputy Prime Minister Dmitry Rogozin arrived in New Delhi recently on a one-day visit to attend IRIGC- TEC meeting. India and Russia agreed to work closely in various sectors, including security, nuclear energy, and disaster management.
- India's first International Financial Services Centre (IFSC) at Gujarat International Finance-Tec City (GIFT) entered into an agreement with Gujarat National Law University (GNLU) to collaborate on efforts for Skill Development in the field of International Financial Services & Regulations.
- Dena Bank has become the first lender to classify Videocon Industries as a bad loan. With the default on payments, Dena Bank has declared Videocon Industries account as non-performing asset (NPA) in the fourth quarter ended March 2017.
- Markets regulator Stock Exchange board of India (Sebi) allowed investors to buy mutual fund schemes for up to Rs 50,000 through digital wallets, making it easier for them especially the young generation to purchase these instruments.
- The 29th edition of Co-ordinated Patrol (CORPAT) between India-Indonesia commenced in Port Blair. Two minesweepers of the Indian Navy INS Karwar and INS Kakinada were decommissioned after being in service for over 30 years.
- Top Indian and American officials discussed ways to strengthen maritime security cooperation during the two-day India-US Maritime Security Dialogue in Rhode Island.
- Indian Railway Catering and Tourism Corporation (IRCTC) is now offering home delivery of rail tickets and will allow passengers to make payment through any payment mode, including cash. It has now introduced pay-on-delivery (PoD) service, allowing passengers to book train tickets online and pay at the time of delivery. The Indian Railways will float global tenders worth over Rs.100 crore for acquiring End of Train Telemetry (EoTT) equipment to run 1,000 trains without guards. This equipment is used to establish communication between the locomotive driver and the last wagon of the train to ensure that the train is running with all coaches/wagons as a complete unit.
- The government has named Road Transport and Highways Secretary Sanjay Mitra as its new defence secretary in a top-level bureaucratic reshuffle. Mitra will take over as the secretary after the present incumbent, G Mohan Kumar, completes his tenure on May 24,2017 an order issued by the Department of Personnel and Training (DoPT).
- Microblogging platform Twitter has elevated Taranjeet Singh as its Country Director for India. Mr. Singh was earlier leading the charge for sales and marketing support for Twitter's advertisers in India. Konkona Sensharma has been named the best director for her directorial debut 'A Death in the

Gunj' and the best actress for 'Lipstick Under My Burkha' at 2017's New York Indian Film Festival (NYIFF).

- In a promising step for Indian basketball, the national Basketball Association (NBA) inaugurated its first ever academy in Greater Noida.  
Senior NCP leader and former Maharashtra minister Arjun Tulshiram Pawar passed away after prolonged illness.
- ICICI Bank chief Chanda Kochhar has become the first Indian woman to be conferred with the prestigious Woodrow Wilson Award for Global Corporate Citizenship.
- Bengaluru named the world's most affordable tech city in the new Savills Tech Cities Index 2017. Overall, Bengaluru ranks 20th among tech cities in the world while Austin topped the list.
- Prime Minister Modi visited Sri Lanka which is a sign of "strong relationship" between the two countries and brings to the fore the shared heritage of Buddhism. He participated in the International Vesak Day celebrations, the biggest festival of Buddhists.
- Justice (Retd.) Mukul Mudgal was elected as head of International Federation of Association Football (FIFA's) governance committee at the world football governing body's 67th Congress in Bahrain's capital city of Manama.
- Union Minister of Road Transport and Highways Nitin Gadkari launched the National Highways Authority of India (NHAI) Masala Bond at the London Stock Exchange, UK. LIC Housing Finance launched a new product 'Griha Siddhi' which will offer loans for construction, purchase of the house or flat and repairs or renovation to the existing properties. Under the new product, borrowers will be offered the interest rate of 8.40% up to Rs 25 lakh and for loans up to Rs 1 crore the interest rate will be 8.50% per annum. For women borrowers, the mortgage lender is offering a special interest rate of 8.35% for loans up to Rs 25 lakh.
- SBI will charged at Rs. 25 per ATM withdrawal charge but this will be applicable only to customers of its mobile wallet State Bank Buddy.
- RBI put restriction on Kolkata-based PSU UCO Bank's lending and branch expansion plans as the state-run lender made net losses for the two-successive fiscal amid severe stress on asset quality. It has initiated 'Prompt Corrective Action' (PCA) framework on UCO bank on account of high bad loans and negative return of assets. UCO is the second lender after IDBI Bank to face this.
- HDFC Life has entered into a bancassurance tie-up with Catholic Syrian Bank to distribute its individual life insurance products to the private lender's customers. India has taken a new initiative to supply cheap LED bulbs for the citizens of London in the United Kingdom. Taking this process to the final stages India will launch 'UJALA' scheme in the United Kingdom. UJALA is globally one of the largest efficiency programs which is run by Energy Efficiency Services Ltd
- Cabinet approve signing of Fuel Supply Agreement (FSA) with Letter of Assurance (LoA) holders of Thermal Power Plants(TPPs), and Introduces a new more transparent coal allocation policy for Power Sector, 2017-SHAKTI (Scheme for Harnessing and Allocating Koyala (Coal) Transparently in India). - The government has selected five merchant bankers, including Goldman Sachs & Citigroup, to manage the government's 3 per cent stake sale in IOC (Indian Oil Corporation) which could fetch about Rs 6,000 crore to the exchequer. The other bankers who have been selected by the Department of Investment & Public Asset Management (DIPAM) for managing the stake sale are Deutsche Equities, SBI Capital Markets & ICICI Securities. Indian Oil Corporation has overtaken Oil & Natural Gas Corporation (ONGC) to become India's most profitable state-owned company. Mukesh Ambani-led Reliance Industries retained the crown of being India's most profitable private company for the third year in a row. Employees Provident Fund Organisation has approved hike in investment limit in exchange traded funds (ETFs) to 15%, from the existing 10%.
- The government has expanded the Banks Board Bureau (BBB) headed by former comptroller & auditor general Vinod Rai by adding two more members. Former Allahabad Bank chairperson & managing director Shubhalaxmi Panse & private equity player Pradip Shah have been inducted into the board as independent members.
- Harmanpreet Kaur, the captain of India's T20 team has become the first Indian Women cricketer to play in Kia Super League, the England T20 League.  
India captain Virat Kohli is the lone cricketer from the country to feature in the top 10 of the ICC Players Rankings for ODIs as he managed to hold on to his third spot in the batsman's chart. The top three batsmen South Africa's AB de Villiers (874 rating points), Australian David Warner (871) & Kohli (852) are separated by just 22 points.
- Barcelona striker Lionel Messi won the European Golden Shoe for a record-equaling fourth time having scored 37 goals in the Spanish league.  
Alexander Zverev defeated the world no. 2 ranking player Novak Djokovic 6-4, 6-3 to win the Italian Open, 2017. Italian open is also known as Rome Masters & Italian Championship
- Bengaluru FC defeated Mohun Bagan (2-0) to lift 38th Federation Cup football tournament at the Barabati Stadium in Cuttack, Odisha.  
Mumbai Indians lifted the 10th Indian Premier League trophy for the third time, as they recorded a scintillating 1-run win against Rising Pune Supergiant in the title clash at Hyderabad during final. Krunal Pandya from Mumbai Indians was named the man of the match. India's R Vaishali won the women's title with eight points from nine rounds in the Asian Continental Blitz Chess Championship in Chengdu, China.
- Olympic silver medalist P.V. Sindhu became a member of the BWF Athletes' Commission after voting closed for the four places on the representative body.

- India off-spinner Ravichandran Ashwin won the coveted International Cricketer of the Year award at the CEAT Cricket Rating (CCR) International awards 2017. South Korea won Badminton's Sudirman Cup for the first time in 14 years with 3-2 victory over 10-time champions China at Australia's Gold Coast.
- Indian fencer C A Bhavani Devi struck gold in the Turnoi Satellite Fencing Championship at Reykjavik (Iceland). Ferrari's Sebastian Vettel won the 2017 Monaco Grand Prix at the Circuit de Monaco, La Condamine & Monte Carlo, Monaco.
- India will be having its own GPS system, 'NavIC' that will be operational in early 2018. NavIC or 'Navigation with Indian Constellation' the name given by PM Narendra Modi after the launch of Indian Regional Navigation Satellite System IRNSS-1G, is designed to provide accurate position information to users within the country.
- India & Germany inked twelve memoranda of understanding & agreements following bilateral delegation-level talks presided over by PM Narendra Modi & Germany Chancellor Angela Merkel. The agreements inked included nine joint declarations of intent (JDIs) & three memoranda of understanding. The agreements include collaboration in the field of digitalization, skill development, & cooperation in cyber policy. Besides, the two nations also agreed to resume the free trade talks between India & the European Union. PM Narendra Modi has inaugurated the country's longest bridge - the Dholra-Sadia Bridge in Assam. Mr Modi named the bridge after legendary singer Bhupen Hazarika. This three-lane, the 9.15-kilometre bridge has been built over the Brahmaputra river. It links Dholra to Sadia, both in Assam. The bridge will reduce the distance from Rupai on NH- 37 in Assam to Meka-Roing on NH-52 in Arunachal Pradesh by 165 KM.
- India's state-of-the-art high-speed train Tejas Express, which can run up to the speed of 200km per hour, has made its trip between Chhatrapati Shivaji Terminus, Mumbai, & Karmali, North Goa. The 15-coach train has two classes chair car & executive chair car & is equipped with facilities like secured gangways, automatic doors, LCD screens, Wi-Fi, tea-coffee vending machines, magazines, bio-toilets, hand dryers etc.
- India announced a \$500 million line of credit to Mauritius as the two countries resolved to deepen ties in a range of areas including the maritime domain. Israel Aerospace Industries (IAI) has closed another major deal worth 630 million US dollar with India to supply advanced long-range air & missile defense systems for four ships of the Indian Navy. According to State-owned IAI, the contract is for supplying Long Range Surface to Air Missile (LRSAM) systems.
- Japan's cabinet approved a bill that would allow Emperor Akihito to step down, paving the way for the first abdication by a Japanese emperor in nearly two centuries. Japan is going to build a war museum at the hillock at Maiba Lokpa in Bishnupur district in Manipur where a Japanese camp was located during World War II.

The Indian Army received two 155mm/39 caliber Ultra Lightweight Howitzer artillery guns from BAE Systems in the United States of America.

- As part of 'SIMBEX-17', the ongoing Bilateral Naval Exercise between Navies of the Republic of Singapore & India, Indian Naval Ships Shivalik, Sahyadri, Jyoti & Kamorta are participating. SIMBEX is an acronym for "Singapore-India Maritime Bilateral Exercises". This years edition of SIMBEX-17 being held in the South China Sea would be the 24th in the series.
- Union Defence & Finance Minister Arun Jaitley inaugurated the Defence Research & Development Organisation's (DRDO)'s new Aeronautical Test Range (ATR) in Karnataka. The ATR is a facility under the Aeronautical Development Establishment (ADE) which works on a range of UAVs (unmanned air vehicles). United States has for the first time successfully tested its defence system against an Intercontinental Ballistic Missile (ICBM). A ground-based interceptor was launched at a California air base & shot down a mock ballistic missile. As per the Pentagon, the test comes after Pyongyang fired its ninth missile this year.
- India has jumped 16 places in the revised United Nations World Tourism Organisation (UNWTO) rankings to settle at 24th for 2014 & 2015. The Visakhapatnam railway station is the cleanest, followed by Secunderabad, among the 75 busiest stations in the country. According to a survey, the report of which was released by

railway minister Suresh Prabhu, the Jammu railway station occupied the third spot, while the New Delhi station was ranked at 39 among the busiest stations. The survey was carried out by the Quality Council of India. The Darbhanga railway station in Bihar was the dirtiest among the busiest stations.

- Two Indian cities — Mumbai & Kota — have been named among the world's most crowded in a list topped by Dhaka, according to World Economic Forum (WEF) citing UN-Habitat data. Dhaka, the capital of Bangladesh, is the most crowded city on the planet, followed by India's financial capital Mumbai. Kota in Rajasthan was ranked seventh.
- Indian tax laws are perceived to be second most complex in the Asia-Pacific region, becoming even less predictable over the last three years, according to Deloitte survey. India ranks only after China in having most complex jurisdiction for taxation & most complicated requirements of tax, the Asia Pacific Tax Complexity Survey conducted by Deloitte.
- According to India Development Report released by World Bank, India had one of the lowest female participation in the workforce, ranking 120th among 131 countries.
- May 21st is observed as Anti-Terrorism Day in the memory of former Indian PM Mr Rajiv Gandhi who passed away on this day.
