

# UTS Scholarship Conditions of Award International Undergraduate Full Tuition Scholarship

## **UTS International**

This document sets out the conditions of award for the below scholarship ('Scholarship') as well as the obligations of recipients ('Recipient') and UTS in regards to this Scholarship. The administrative processes to support awarding this Scholarship will be managed, and may be amended, in accordance with UTS Rules, Policy and Procedures.

## 1. SCHOLARSHIP NAME: International Undergraduate Full Tuition Scholarship

#### 2. PURPOSE

This Scholarship was established to support high achieving commencing international students enrolling in an undergraduate program at UTS in Sydney.

#### 3. VALUE AND BENEFIT

#### 3.1 Number of Recipients:

Up to two (2) new recipients will be awarded the scholarships annually in 2019 and 2020. A maximum of one (1) recipient will be awarded the Scholarship in each of the Autumn and Spring intakes in 2019 and 2020.

# 3.2 Benefit/s to Recipient:

- UTS will pay each Recipient the UTS tuition fees for the approved Bachelor degree course for the duration of the Scholarship ("the payment") as defined in Clause 4.
- The Scholarship cannot be transferred, deferred or redeemed for cash.

# 3.3 Payment of benefit/s:

- The payment will be made directly to the recipient's UTS fees account each teaching session for the duration of the Scholarship as defined in clause 4;
- Payments are subject to the Recipient satisfying ongoing eligibility criteria as defined in clause 8 below.

#### 4. DURATION

The duration of the Scholarship is the standard number of sessions required for completion of the Recipient's enrolled undergraduate course on the basis of a full-time study load, as specified in the letter of offer for admission to the course. Where the Recipient does not follow the usual standard full-time course structure, the total value of the Scholarship may be exhausted prior to course completion. The maximum duration of the Scholarship is eight sessions under any program.

#### **5. ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA**

To be eligible for the Scholarship, an applicant must:

- be an international student at the time of application (not an Australian citizen, New Zealand citizen or permanent resident of Australia); and
- meet all admission requirements for the selected course; and
- commence full-time studies on campus; and
- have completed an Australian Year 12 or high school studies comparable to an Australian Year 12, no longer than three (3) years prior to commencing at UTS and be admitted based on this qualification to UTS; and

- have an overall mark of 85% or equivalent in a UTS recognized high school qualification; and
- all applicants must apply using the UTS online Scholarships Application form to be eligible.

NOTE: Students enrolling in a UTS transnational program are not eligible to apply for this scholarship.

## **6. RECIPIENT SELECTION CRITERIA**

The Scholarship will be awarded to the highest ranked applicant(s) on the basis of academic merit in the academic qualification used as a basis for admission into the selected UTS Bachelor degree program coupled with the applicant's response to the following question: "How do you intend to use your UTS degree to make a positive contribution to the community?"

Decisions to award Scholarships will be made solely by the Scholarships Committee, as described in Clause 7 below, in its absolute discretion.

#### 7. SELECTION

Applications of eligible candidates will be presented to a Scholarships Selection Committee, which will undertake the selection of Recipients, usually in October/November of the previous year for Session 1 and in May/June for Session 2.

The Scholarships Committee will be made up of at least three relevant members of the UTS community and will be chaired by the Director, UTS International (or nominee).

Offers will be authorised by the chair of the Scholarship Selection Committee. No correspondence will be entered into regarding the selection of Recipients.

## 8. ONGOING RECIPIENT ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

## 8.1 Academic progress:

• The Recipient must maintain the minimum progression rules of the University for the duration of the Scholarship. If the minimum progression rules are not maintained, payment of the Scholarship may be suspended or terminated, unless the Recipient can demonstrate exceptional circumstances for the consideration of the Scholarship Selection Committee. Exceptional circumstances may include, but are not limited to, disability, ongoing illness, carer's responsibilities and other educational barriers, and are considered by the Scholarships Office case-by-case.

# 8.2 UTS Enrolment:

The Recipient of the Scholarship:

- must continue to be enrolled as a full-time (22-24 credit points in Autumn and Spring sessions)
  international student in an undergraduate course at UTS, unless he/she has been approved to study a
  reduced study load through the standard International Student Visa Holders Application to Reduce
  Study Load application process through a UTS Student Centre; and
- must continue to be enrolled as an international student in their first enrolled undergraduate degree course at UTS.
- the Scholarship is not transferable to other UTS courses.

# 8.3 Leave / Deferral / Course withdrawal:

- All deferral requests are subject to approval from UTS.
- If the Recipient defers the UTS offer or withdraws from the UTS course after the start of his/her first session, the Scholarship will be terminated and any tuition fee Scholarship payment already made for that session will be reversed.
- After the first session, if the Recipient can demonstrate exceptional circumstances, he/she may apply
  to the Scholarships Office and UTS International for an approved leave of absence from studies. The
  Scholarship will be terminated if the Recipient takes leave without approval from both the
  Scholarships Office and UTS International.

# 8.4 Other obligations and conditions:

- The offer of the Scholarship is made subject to all information provided by the Recipient being true and accurate.
- By accepting the offer of the Scholarship, each Recipient agrees to the Conditions of Award.

- Recipients must comply with all of UTS's rules, policies and procedures including those relating to conduct.
- The offer of the Scholarship is only valid for the intake defined in the Scholarship letter of offer and cannot be deferred.
- The Recipient is responsible for advising the Scholarships Office of any changes in circumstances that would make him/her ineligible for continuation of the Scholarship, including but not limited to taking Leave of Absence or deferring study, and changing his/her international students visa status to another visa category, including but not limited to Permanent Residency Visa.
- If the Recipient obtains Permanent Residency status, the Scholarship will be terminated as outlined below:
  - o For Recipients obtaining Permanent Residency before Census date in any Session: The Scholarship will be terminated and any Scholarship payment already made for that session will be reversed.
  - For Recipients obtaining their Permanent Residency after census date in any Session: the Scholarship will be terminated the following session.
- Any changes to the Recipient's circumstances not addressed by the Conditions of Award will be considered by the Scholarships Office and UTS International on a case-by-case basis.
- The Recipient does not need to re-apply for the Scholarship each year.
- For the duration of the Scholarship the Recipient is not permitted to hold other UTS Scholarships, unless an equity-based scholarship is approved by exception.
- The recipient must consent to allowing his/her name, photograph or short article to be used for the promotion of UTS.

#### 9. TERMINATION OF RECIPIENT'S SCHOLARSHIP

The Scholarship will terminate:

- If the Recipient ceases to meet the eligibility criteria; or
- If the Recipient breaches any conditions of the Scholarship; or
- If UTS determines that the student is guilty of misconduct and after consultation with the Director, SAU the delegate able to award the Scholarship deems that it is not appropriate for the Recipient to continue to hold the Scholarship.
