New Creation Church Supports The National Orange Ribbon Celebrations 2008

Racial harmony, an essential building block of society, must not be taken for granted and every individual has a role to play — that's the message that New Creation Church will be sending out across the nation on Sunday, 6 July 2008.

To support this belief, New Creation Church will be distributing 16,000 orange ribbon pins from the Central Singapore Community Development Council (CS CDC) to our 16,000-strong congregation. Teams of ushers will be handing the pins out on Sunday, 6 July 2008, as the congregation gathers for Sunday church services. Pre-service announcements will be made to inform them of this important national campaign and encourage them to show their support by wearing the pins every Sunday during the month of July 2008.

This event has been organised as part of the inaugural National Orange Ribbon Celebrations 2008. The colour orange is the colour of "understanding, warmth, tribal or family love, spiritual commitment, happiness and kinship", and the orange ribbon "symbolises harmony and friendship across the races".

By participating actively in the Celebrations, New Creation Church hopes to raise awareness of the importance of racial harmony in our multi-ethnic and multi-cultural nation. Said Deacon Matthew Kang, Honorary Secretary of the Church Council, "We believe that people of all races, ethnicities and cultures are precious to God and that by supporting this campaign, we are expressing God's love for them in a unified manner. We are privileged to be a part of this meaningful event and we hope to make a difference in the lives of our fellow Singaporeans."
